MARY RUNGE MEMORIAL



This summer, over 300 children will have learned to shoot a bow on the new Mary Runge Archery Range. Located on the south side of the Nature Center, the range was made possible by a memorial gift from Mary Runge of Racine.

Mary was an avid outdoors woman and was a long time River Bend supporter and volunteer. She passed away in December of

2012, leaving a gift to be used for a significant project at River Bend. After consulting with River Bend, her family decided the archery range was a fitting project. The gift paid for bows, arrows, targets, protective backdrop curtain, arm guards, and the tools to maintain equipment.

In addition, several other groups and individuals made this range possible: Steve Hysell of Hysell Archery sold us all the bows, arrows and safety equipment at cost. Shane and Nancy Hill have been our teachers, mentors and consultants throughout the project. They trained our trainers, helped select equipment, made equipment for us and lent us equipment when we were short. This project would have been tougher without them. Finally, the volunteers and staff of River Bend have contributed greatly to clearing the land for the range, building quivers, installing poles, and so much more.

LEADERSHIP RACINE-MURAL PROJECT



The main lodge at the River Bend Nature Center, has an improved educational display and a new wall mural through a community project from a Leadership Racine Class of 2013 team. The display table, containing nearly 30 items, including deer antlers, snake skins, wasp nests and fur pelts, was upgraded with labels, photographs and brief descriptions of each item. This allows visitors to handle the wildlife and plant items from the Nature Center property, learn about what they are touching and keep the display intact.

The Leadership Racine team members — Linda Szymczak,

Tony Lewis, Amy Vanderhoef, Chris Greco and Paul Holley — researched the description information, prepared the labels and raised private donations for the wall mural in the main lodge's lobby area.

The new mural was both a learning experience — and a first-time collaboration — for mother-daughter artist team Anna and Sara Slaviero of Kenosha. The artwork, which covers the main lodge's east wall near the coat racks, was based on the design of the current RBNC brochure cover. Anna and Sara took the brochure's blue butterfly amid cattails and water then added elements around the edges, including a small green frog, an oak leaf, a pine cone, a bird house and a cricket.

The mural is intended to be interactive – without electronics, explains Anna. "We want them (RBNC visitors) to look at the painting and then go and find the object on the table," she says. As fun as creating art is for the pair, they also enjoy learning what they're creating. "I can't just paint something," says Anna. "I have to be knowledgeable about it."
